2. Add a 3-step exploded diagram and a 15-second short video for top-lid opening and closing (remove top lid → align bottom with metal rods → press latches on both sides back in), and overlay a 'top entry' usage illustration on the second main image to replace text instructions that fail to convey operational details; users have already organically validated the ability of video to resolve doubts.
3. Add safety reinforcement guidance to the bullet points: state clearly that 'the four plastic clips are for auxiliary fixation; before transport, be sure to tighten the 6 sets of screws and nuts,' include a screw-location diagram, and make 'spare clips and a dedicated wrench included from the factory' a verifiable promise; if feasible, switch to a factory-preassembled main body with only a few easy-to-tighten screws left.

Overall Summary

The main product (PetVoyage 2-door top-load hard-shell pet carrier) remains a highly rated item on the product page—4.6 stars, ~91% positive reviews, 65k+ ratings, firmly at the top of the dog hard-shell carrier category; however, this collection of 500 samples was pain-point-first (401 from the main ASIN, plus 65 from DEMO-C and 34 from DEMO-B on the same page), and sentiment clearly skews toward negative reviews, exposing four structural issues: top-lid opening/closing, shell plastic strength, missing parts on arrival, and factory QC; notably, the 'top-load' design itself is best reviewed (all 32 positive), while the real complaints are about its hinges and opening/closing feel—the problem is not the direction but execution quality and delivery consistency.

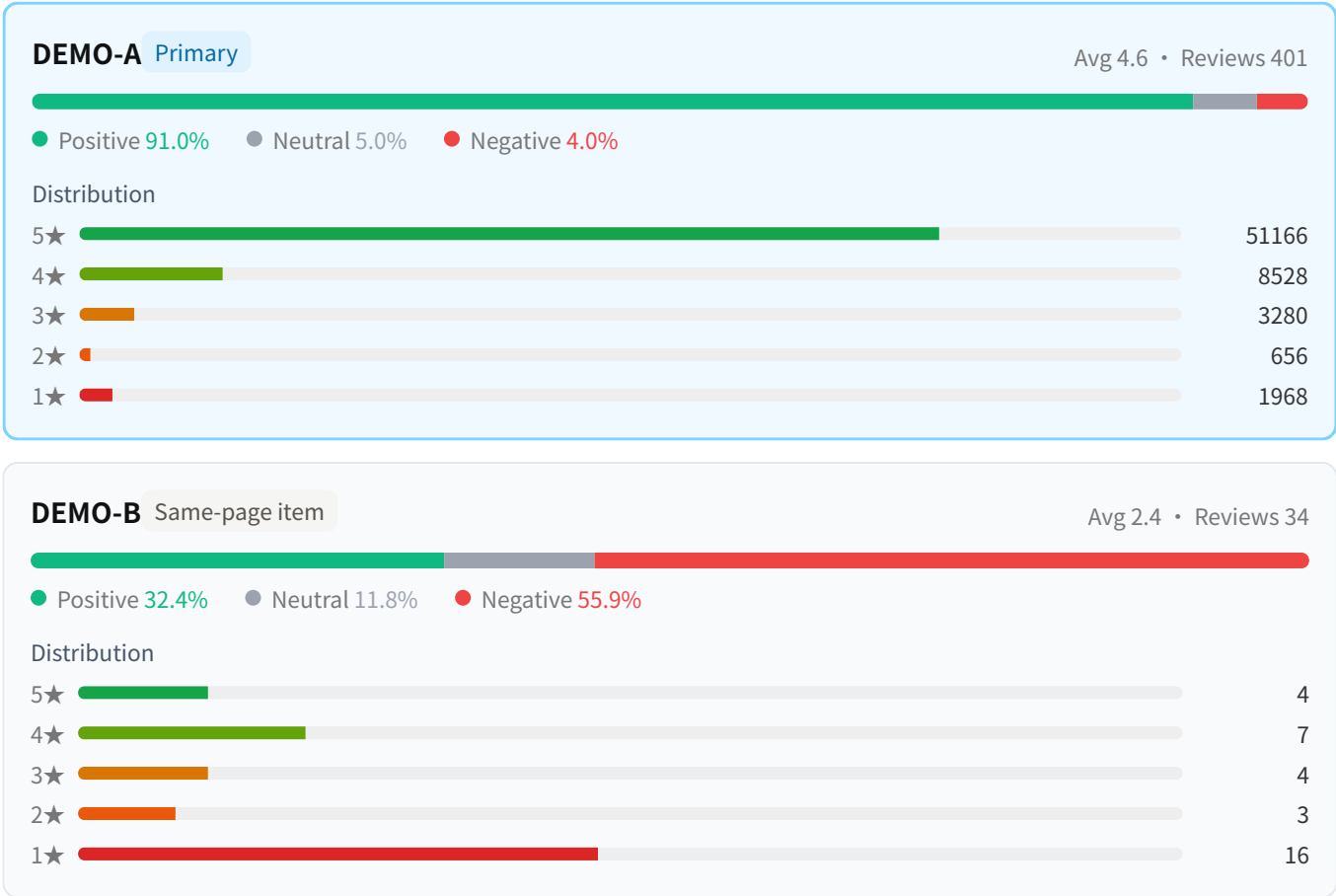

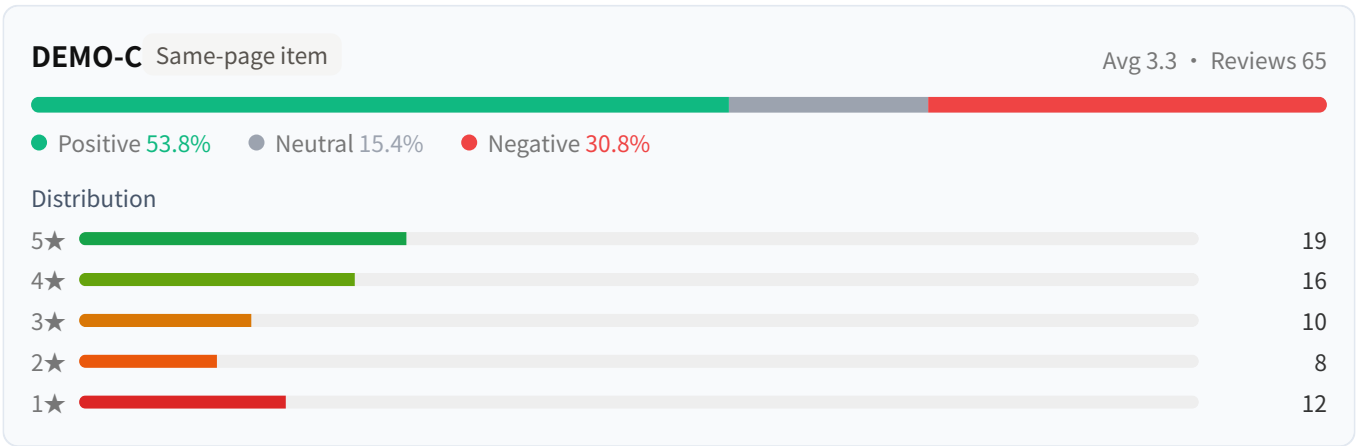
